Do Your Friendships Live Out the Gospel?

Friendship can be difficult. This is true of friendships both inside and outside the church. Why is friendship with believers sometimes difficult? Do our friendships merely scratch the surface of meaningful relationship? Do we pursue friendships where people can reveal their deepest struggles?

What is biblical friendship?

"Biblical friendships exist when two or more people, bound together by a common faith in Jesus Christ, pursue him and his kingdom with intentionality and vulnerability... (it) serves primarily to bring glory to Christ..."

Drawing from Proverbs, Tim Keller identifies four characteristics of friendship:

Constancy . A friend abides over the long term. He is closer than a brother. (Prov. 18:24)

Candor. A friend speaks love and truth for the good of a friend. (Prov. 27:5-6)

Carefulness. A friend is cautious in how and when he speaks wisdom. (Prov. 25:20)

Counsel. A friend speaks pointedly to encourage growth and godliness.

What biblical friendship is not:

It is not a social media friendship which is a relational substitute.

It is not a specialized friendship centered on a common activity or interest.

It is not a selfish friendship focused on the best interest of the self.

How to Form Biblical Friendships:

Invest time.

Embrace the right attitude and goals. Talk.

Share meals.

Confront with care.

Threats to Biblical Friendship:

Personal sin.

The fear of being vulnerable.

False expectations.

"Through biblical friendship our shared lives can testify to the unity that comes from God himself."
