

One of the joys of the Christian life is found when we encourage one another through acts of service. But at times, we may not have the right attitude. Is God concerned about our attitude as well as our actions? YES. Some of us have begrudged service to certain people who seem to always need something from us. But let's consider our attitudes and actions in light of these kind of scenarios.

Paul helps us with this as he commands the church at Galatia to "serve one another" (Gal. 5:13). The Greek word for serve is douleuo, which is more accurately translated as "to enslave". Although somewhat alarming, this command carries with it the powerful action of submitting in service as a slave to another. The command is clear and yet the attitude is even greater, for the "greatest of these is love" (1 Cor. 13:13) . LOVE is the attitude with which we serve one another. The NIV translates this as "serve one another humbly in LOVE" (Gal. 5:13).

This attitude is only produced as we "walk in the Spirit" and bear the fruit of the Spirit. "The fruit is the Spirit is LOVE ... " (Gal. 5:22). Yield yourself daily to the Spirit of God and begin to allow His fruit to be produced in your life and in our church.

As a church body, we have the privilege of encouraging one another by serving one another, in LOVE.
