

Intro: Addictions/Enslavements/Bondage are spiritual issues.

Notes:		

- ➤ Man's theories about addictions often do not line up with scripture, God's truth about sin.
- One of man's theories: The addict is a victim; suffering from a disease; part of their DNA passed down to them, not their fault.

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- > Idols are really God replacements.
- In an attempt to avoid pain, an addict will pick something other than God to worship. (Alcohol, drugs, food, sex, porn) Learned behavior of replacing pain with something that brings temporary pleasure.
- ➤ The addict trades the truth of God for an idol that appears to meet his or her self-centered desires and sinful passions.
- ➤ With a goal to feeling good, the addict trades God's truth for a lie and becomes enslaved.

Romans 1:²⁵ They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator—who is forever praised. Amen.


Notes:			

- > The real issue with addictions is a heart problem.
- ➤ Sin in the heart is the root of a person's problems What is needed is a biblical diagnosis. Sin must be called "sin," not an illness, syndrome, or emotional problem

Mark Shaw is the founder and President of Truth in Love Ministries and part of the ACBC family, he gives five things to listen for when counseling an addict.

Entitlement Mentality –

- a. What are the desires of the heart? ("lusts of flesh" Eph.2:3)
- b. What are the lies being embraced? (2 Cor. 10:5. James 1:14-16, Eph. 4:22)
- c. What are the habits that have formed? (Eph. 4:22-24)

Six R's to Recovery - Dr. Nicolas Ellen

Steps:	Scripture	Solutions to life's Problems
1. Realization	2 Tim. 2:24-26	realizing the truth of God
2. Remorse	2 Cor. 7:8-10	a sorrow over my sin
3. Renounce	Psalm 32:1-5	acknowledge & confess
4. Repent	2 Cor. 7:10-11	turning away from the sin committed
5. Renew	Romans 12:2	learn a new way of thinking and living
6. Replace	Eph. 4:19-24	putting off the old replacing with the new

Realization/Thoughts – 2 Cor. 10:3-5; 11:3, Phil. 4:8

Romans 8: ⁵ Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. ⁶ The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace. ⁷ The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so.

2 Timothy 2: ²⁴ And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. ²⁵ Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, ²⁶ and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.

Remorse/Desires - 2 Cor. 7:8-10

2 Corinthians 7: ⁸ Even if I caused you sorrow by my letter, I do not regret it.
Though I did regret it—I see that my letter hurt you, but only for a little while—

⁹ yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us. ¹⁰ Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.

• A good desire becomes a bad desire when it becomes a ruling desire

Renounce/ Forgiven - Psalm 32:1-5

Psalm 32: ¹ Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. ² Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit. ³ When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. ⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. ⁵ Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD." And you forgave the guilt of my sin.

Repent/Freedom in Christ – 2 Cor. 7:10-11

2 Corinthians 7: ¹⁰ Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death. ¹¹ See what this godly sorrow has produced in you: what earnestness, what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what alarm, what longing, what concern, what readiness to see justice done. At every point you have proved yourselves to be innocent in this matter.

Renew/Habits/Transformed - Romans 12:1-2

Romans 12: 1Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. ² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Replace/ Choices – Eph. 4:19-24 - Radical Amputation is required

Ephesians 4: ¹⁹ Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, and they are full of greed. ²⁰ That, however, is not the way of life you learned ²¹ when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. ²² You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be made new in the attitude of your minds; ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

Idolatry – Purchase an "Idols of the Heart Chart"
