



THE SEVEN A'S OF CONFESSION

Matt. 7:3-5; 1 John 1;8-9; Prov. 28:13
ADDRESS everyone involved
AVOID if, but, and maybe
ADMIT specifically
ACKNOWLEDGE the hurt
ACCEPT the consequences
ALTER your behavior
ASK for forgiveness
