Elijah - Fighting the Battles of God

Introduction:

I. ELIJAH AND THE PEOPLE (vs. 20-24)

- A. First He Chastens Them (vs. 20-22)
 - "So Ahab sent a message among all the sons of Israel and brought the prophets together at Mount Carmel."
 - "How long will you hesitate between two opinions? If the LORD is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow him."
 - "But the people did not answer him a word."
 - "I alone am left a prophet of the LORD, but Baal's prophets are 450 men."
- B. Then He Challenges Them (vs. 23-24)
 - "Now let them give us two oxen..."
 - "Then you call on the name of your god, and I will call on the name of the LORD, and the God who answers by fire, He is God."
 - "And all the people said, 'That is a good idea.' "

II. ELIJAH AND THE PROPHETS (vs. 25-29)

- A. The Set-Up (vs.25-26)
 - "Choose one ox for yourselves and prepare it..."
 - "Then...they prepared it and called on the name of Baal from morning until noon saying, 'O Baal, answer us.' But there was no voice and no one answered."
 - "And they leaped about the altar which they made."
- B. The Sarcasm (vs. 27-29a)
 - "It came about at noon, that Elijah mocked them and said..."
 - "So they cried with a loud voice and cut themselves..."
 - "When midday was past, they raved until the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice."
- C. The Silence (vs. 29b)
 - "but there was no voice, no one answered, and no one paid attention"



III. ELIJAH AND THE LORD (vs. 30-46)

- A. The Fire from Heaven (vs. 30-40)
 - "'Come near to me.' ... And he repaired the altar of the LORD which had been torn down."
 - "Fill four pitchers with water and pour it on the burnt offering and on the wood."
 - "At the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice..."
 - "O LORD, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, today let it be known that You are God in Israel and that I am Your servant and I have done all these things at Your word. Answer me, O LORD, answer me, that this people may know that You, O LORD, are God, and that You have turned their heart back again."
 - "Then the fire of the LORD fell..."
 - "Then all the people saw it, they fell on their faces; and they said, 'The LORD, He is God; the LORD, He is God.' "
 - "Then Elijah said to them, 'Seize the prophets of Baal; do not let one of them escape.'"
 - "So they seized them; and Elijah brought them down to the brook Kishon, and slew them there."
- B. The Flood from Heaven (vs. 41-46)
 - "Go up, eat and drink; for there is the sound of the roar of a heavy shower."
 - "But Elijah went up to the top of Carmel; and he crouched down on the earth and put his face between his knees."
 - "Go up now, look toward the sea."
 - "It came about at the seventh time, that he said, 'Behold, a cloud as small as a man's hand is coming up from the sea.' "
 - "Go up, say to Ahab, 'Prepare your chariot and go down, so that the heavy shower does not stop you.'"
 - "In a little while the sky grew black with clouds and wind, and there was a heavy shower."
 - "And Ahab rode and went to Jezreel. Then the hand of the LORD was on Elijah, and he girded up his loins and outran Ahab to Jezreel."

Conclusion:

- 1) We obey God's commands to the degree that we believe His promises.
- 2) There comes a time when our personal faith must become public loyalty.
- 3) You need to decide who your real master is so you won't be a prisoner of fear, torn between loyalties.

Food for Thought:

- 1) Is there any connection between natural disasters (weather, etc.) and God's warnings to people?
- 2) To what extent do you believe Christian leaders ought to be "troublers" in society?
- 3) How could Elijah be so sure that God would answer his prayer for fire to come down from heaven?
- 4) What is keeping you from unqualified loyalty to Christ?
