- A. Five Directives for the Proper Use of Money
 - 1) Don't let your money produce pride.
 - 2) Don't base your security on uncertain riches. (Proverbs 23:4-5)
 - 3) Recognize that the Lord owns everything you have. (Proverbs 3:9-10; Malachi 4:8-10)
 - 4) Study to make your contributions in other ways besides money.
 - 5) Give sacrificially to the Lord be liberal and generous. (Luke 6:38)

B. Seven Lessons to be Learned from Scripture

- 3) Those who have money must not be given preferential treatment. (James 2:2-4)

- 5) You must learn to distinguish wants from needs. (Hebrews 13:5-6)
- 6) Discipline yourself to spend less than you make.
- 7) Money must be used for eternal purposes.

Conclusion:
