A. They are subtle. (vs. 6a)

“for among them are those who enter into households”

B. They are seductive. (vs. 6b)

“they captivate weak women weighed down with sins, led on by various impulses”

C. They are sly. (vs 7)

“always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth”

III. BE PREPARED TO SHOOT (vs. 8-9)

A. Name Names (vs. 8a)

“just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses”

B. Expose Error (vs. 8b)

“these men also oppose the truth, men of depraved mind, rejected in regard to the faith”

C. Trust the Truth (vs. 9)

“they will not make further progress”

“for their folly will be obvious to all, just as Jannes’s and Jambres’s folly was also”

Conclusion:

- 1) Being faithful to the truth of God’s Word may actually make your life more difficult.
- 2) The Devil will use any and every trick in the book to trip you up and cause you to stumble.
- 3) Take great care that your godliness is genuine, not just a formality.
